

From Single Tooth to Full Arch Surgical Considerations in Immediate Implant Placement for Soft-Tissue Integrity

Program Description

Over the years, it has been demonstrated that an excellent restoration alone does not imply aesthetic success without adequate soft-tissue conditions. When facing the restorative phase of implant treatment there needs to be an accurate symbiosis between surgery and the restorative phase. The surgeon must know the restorative prerequisites of ideal implant placement and conservative minimal invasive incision approaches to be able to create various soft-tissue volumes: thickness, density, centeredness around the coronal of the implant. Often, the dentist must adequately assess the soft-tissue situation to identify the type of necessary surgery and bone grafting procedures or soft-tissue grafting associated with the donor site tissue selection and determine the anticipated time of healing. Before starting the prosthetic phase, it is essential to recognize the potential of the implant site that needs to be restored. It is important for maintaining the emergence contour in cases of immediate implant placement or to recreate it by uncovering technique and provisional restorations. The level and volume of tissue are key to decision making for bone level implant abutment selection, abutment design and tissue level multi-unit restorations. Following this concept regarding what we do daily around implants, it has been demonstrated over the years that if there is sufficient soft-tissue, this can reduce bone remodeling on peri-implant.

Program Objectives

- Controlling the soft-tissue volumes & scalloping
- Management of periodontal surgery and prosthetic concept around implants to maximize the peri-implant soft-tissue aesthetics.
- Less invasive surgical procedures for achieving gingival integration for aesthetic success.
- The compensating bone and soft-tissue resorption by utilizing provisional.
- How to maintain gingival architecture by profile emergence in case of immediate implant placement of the final restorations.
- How to use natural teeth as provisional in immediate implant loading by controlling the soft-tissue volume.
- Different techniques for additional connective soft-tissue graft to improve aesthetic and functional results.
- Attitude between maintaining or recreating the emergence profile for soft-tissue.
- Improve knowledge and skills regarding implants into the aesthetic area.
